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Piedmont Triad School Districts Team Up to Talk Careers in Public Education

Human Resources Experts Share Pathways to Public Education Careers

Alamance-Burlington Schools is teaming up with seventeen (17) other school districts in North Carolina's Piedmont region to host free virtual information sessions for members of the public who are interested in careers in public education. On May 4th and 5th from noon until 1:00 pm, Human Resources professionals in the Piedmont Triad Education Consortium (PTEC) will share insider tips on a wide variety of employment opportunities available in local school districts. Each virtual session via Zoom is free by registering in advance at www.ptecnet.org/announcements.

Participants can choose to attend separate sessions on careers for classified staff positions in Transportation, School Nutrition, Custodial Services, or for classroom specialties such as Teacher Assistants. Certified staff career sessions will include Teacher, Counselor, Social Worker, and School Administrator positions. Classroom teacher pathways are available for individuals with four year degrees and for those without degrees.
