



What is Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support?

PBIS provides a framework to ensure that all students have access to the most effective instructional and behavioral practices throughout the school. Newlin will begin implementing this framework during the 2010-2011 school year. PBIS is designed to provide all of our students with positive expectations and reinforcements. In order for Newlin to increase learning in the classrooms, we first must capture the hearts of our students and provide them with the opportunity to gain ownership in what they are learning.

How will this affect my child(ren) at Newlin?

Newlin will have school-wide rules and consequences. Every teacher will have the same positive expectations and reinforcements for each child, no matter their location in the school. Students will have the opportunity to earn rewards for exhibiting P.R.I.D.E. Not only this, but your child will develop a more positive outlook on school and their learning!

What is P.R.I.D.E.?

Newlin Wildcats have PRIDE. Each letter of P.R.I.D.E. stands for a different expectation that we have at Newlin.

P is for Participate Safely.

R is for Be Respectful.

I is for Be an Individual.

D is for Do our Best.

E is for Engage in Learning.
