

Practice: Algebra 1 Open Response Questions

Some of the questions will require you to write a numerical answer rather than select an answer from several choices. These are open response questions.

Guidelines

1. Write only one digit or symbol in each box. Spaces are permitted before or after your answer, but not within the answer. Darken the corresponding circle below each box. The computer scores based on the darkened circles.
2. For a negative number, write a negative sign in the top of the leftmost column. Darken the top circle below.
3. Do not use symbols such as comas or dollar signs. See Examples D and E. Use only symbols that are provided in the circles.
4. If an answer is a mixed number, it must be changed and entered as an improper fraction or a decimal. Example C has the mixed number four and one-half, which is $\frac{9}{2}$ as an improper fraction or 4.5 as a decimal.

Examples

Enter the numbers below into the grids. (See the notes for more guidance.)

A	B	C	D	E
-18.2	$\frac{5}{10}$	$4 \frac{1}{2}$	5,600	\$25.99

A -18.2 can be answered as -18.2, or as -18.20. (Equal numbers are fine.)

B $\frac{5}{10}$ can be also answered as $\frac{1}{2}$, as 0.5 or as .5. (Equal numbers are fine.)

C $4 \frac{1}{2}$ can be answered as $\frac{9}{2}$ or as 4.5. Spaces in a number are not permitted. Also, the entry of 41/2 with no space would be read as 41 divided by 2.

D 5,600 should be answered as 5600. (Commas are not permitted.)

E \$25.99 should be answered as 25.99. (Dollar signs are not permitted.)
