


Letter to parents



Dear Parents,

We will be having our school's Field Days on Friday April 5th for K-2nd graders and Friday, April 12th for 3rd-5th graders. These events take place outside beginning promptly at 8:30 am and last until 11:30am on both days and continue for the 3rd-5th graders that afternoon outside (weather permitting) from 1:15pm-2:15pm. During field day, classes will rotate around through the games/stations in a "Carnival" style, where they go from one game to another at the teacher's discretion. Parents are allowed to come to our field day to help your child's teacher if you wish, but for safety and liability reasons, this is not a time for little brothers and sisters to come join in the games. This is meant to be a day of fun and excitement, but we have to keep safety a priority at all times. Your child's lunch schedule has been modified for both field days, so be mindful of the time change if you are thinking about visiting your child during lunch on either of these days (April 5th or 12th). They will be receiving their regular lunch but may have a different location or time.

When entering our Field day, please do NOT go into the building to sign in. Instead, walk around the side of the school toward the blacktop/bus-rider lot (like you do for fall/spring festivals). The main gates for buses to enter will be closed and locked for safety. You will need to enter Field Day using the gate leading into our parking lot behind the school. Please sign in and wear your visitor tag while enjoying Field Day!

During our field days, students will have the opportunity to participate in lots of activities. These activities are designed to be fun, cooperative and competitive. Please put sunscreen on your child before they leave for school the morning of their field day, as we are not allowed to put it on at school. If your child has a water bottle, please fill it and send it with them. We will have water stations and take breaks but this will be extra water for your child. Your child will need to wear sneakers or running shoes that can get dirty for their field day, rather than flip flops or sandals, as they will be doing many activities that require running and jumping outside. Flip flops and sandals are not safe footwear for field day activities.
