CTE has a new face in the department!

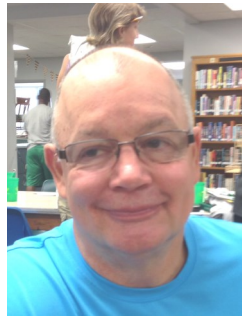
